LAST TIME HERE

Long Melford 1 - 1 Brantham Athletic Thurlow Nunn Premier, Wednesday 27 October

The Stoneylands pitch looked immaculate under the lights and there was a sizeable crowd in attendance.

In the Brantham line-up was Nathan Rowe who played nearly 250 matches for Melford and was part of the team that won the First Division and League Cup. It always adds a little extra spice when a long-serving former player returns to his old stomping ground. It was Rowe who instigated Brantham's goal in the 3rd minute. His diagonal ball set up an attack down the left, a low cross wasn't dealt with by the Melford defence and KIERAN LAWLER slotted the ball into the bottom corner.

After the early setback Melford gradually improved and after a spell of pressure deservedly equalised in the 32nd minute. Skipper JACOB BROWN twisted and turned on the edge of the box before unleashing a left foot piledriver into the top corner, giving Brantham keeper James Askew no chance.

In the second half the best chance fell to Brantham around the hour mark, when Rowe crossed from the right, putting the ball on a plate for a Brantham forward who fired over the bar from close range. Melford also had their own near misses and spells of pressure, including a flurry of corners and a decent penalty shout turned down. On another night either team could have snatched a late winner, but it ended all square and the two sides stay level on 15 points. AC

Jamie Bradbury (Manager) – Now in his fifth season as manager, Jamie guided the club to its highest ever Step 5 points total in 2017/18 and a League Cup Final victory in 2019.

Steve Chisholm (Player/Assistant Manager) – A former Long Melford Youth player who has also played at AFC Sudbury, now combining playing with a management role.

Jonathan Brown (Coach) – A new addition to the coaching team last season, previously with Mildenhall Town.

Brian Dunster (Physio) – A former Melford player and now a very experienced physio, in his 11th season at the club. Previously with Cornard United and Halstead Town.

Matt Walker (Goalkeeper) – Experienced keeper who signed in September 2019 on a dual registration from Coggeshall Town, has also played for Halstead Town.

Steve Adams (Defence/Forward) - Club Captain for several years who lifted the First Division title in 2015 and League Cup in 2019. Began in the Under 18s and has now played 250 senior matches.

Dan Smith (Defence) – Previously with AFC Sudbury, a regular in the team in recent years approaching 150 appearances for the club.

Sam Mills (Defence) – Signed last summer from Haverhill Rovers in a season cut short due to Covid, has also played for Whitton United and AFC Sudbury.

Ross Waugh (Defence) – Ross is now in his ninth season at the club, making well over 250 appearances and chips in with the occasional goal.

Dan Swain (Defence/Midfield) - Over 150 appearances for the club and is comfortable at left back or in midfield. Previously with Cornard, Sudbury and Whitton.

Jake Jackson (Defence/Midfield) - Jake is in his eighth season with the club since joining from AFC Sudbury, a versatile player comfortable at the back or central midfield.

Callum Hemson (Midfield) – Joined in 2017 from AFC Sudbury Academy. Callum has impressed over the last couple of seasons at right back or a more advanced role.

Ben Judge (Midfield) - Former AFC Sudbury Academy player with a promising future. Supporters' Player of the Season 2019/20.

Alfie Parnell (Midfield/Forward) – Impressed in the Reserves last term, played youth football at Needham Market. Scored his first senior goal in the FA Cup in August.

Kyle Hurley (Forward) - Signed in 2019 from Cornard United. A wide player who likes to run at defenders and delivers a great cross.

The Villagers fought back from 2-0 down at half time to earn a point on the road at Fakenham Town.

The two clubs last met in 2019 when Long Melford overcame the Ghosts in the League Cup Final, and it looked like the Norfolk side might have got their revenge when they capitalised on defensive errors to take a quick-fire two-goal lead at half time.

Melford, wearing red socks loaned by Fakenham, were left to rue a series of opportunities that could have seen them on the scoresheet in the first half, while Fakenham had what would have been a third goal ruled out for offside.

However, the Villagers showed their mettle in the second half and fought their way back into the game to take a valuable point.

On 58 minutes, Jamie Griffiths showed strength to shrug off two defenders wide on the left and drilled a low ball across the six yard box to where substitute Hassan Ally was on-hand to tuck away off the underside of the crossbar.

Four minutes later, Griffiths was again the instigator, linking up with Ben Judge in the middle of the park before releasing George Day in behind the Fakenham back line. Day applied a crisp left-foot finish from 20 yards that nestled into the bottom of the net.

Both sides pushed for a winner, and each had solid claims for penalties which were both waved away by the match official, and in the end a share of the spoils was probably the fair result.


