LAST TIME HERE



A deflected free-kick earned Long Melford a 1-1 draw against the league's form team Kirkley & Pakefield at Stoneylands on Saturday.

The visitors had won their previous six league matches and also knocked higher league Felixstowe out of the Suffolk Premier Cup.

The Villagers started in a positive mode and came close on three occasions, but after six minutes the visitors went ahead after a Melford defensive error. A probing pass from Kyle Haylock to GEORGE BARBER saw his shot from 25 yards deflect off a Melford defender, past the advancing keeper Matt Walker to trickle in via the post into the Melford net.

The next blow for Melford after 19 minutes was to lose Will Wingfield with a hamstring problem, to be replaced by Kyle Hurley. After 24 minutes The Royals keeper Jordan Smith made a fine stop with his legs from a Jacob Brown shot. On 35 minutes Melford drew level, a George Day free kick from the Melford right flank was diverted into his own goal by the head of Kirkley midfielder MIGUEL LOPEZ, but a deserved goal for the home team nonetheless.

It was then Melford keeper Walker who on 37 minutes made two excellent saves to keep the goal line intact and a strong penalty call from Kirkley for a Melford challenge in the box but this was rejected by the referee.

The game continued into the second half with plenty of end to end play, with chances to snatch a winner at both ends. On 60 minutes a Haylock corner was headed goalwards by Jack Herbert but defender Dan Smith cleared off the line for Melford. Towards the end of the game Melford had two golden chances, substitute Callum Hemson got through twice on goal but keeper Jordan Smith made two fantastic saves to prevent Melford winning.

THE VILLAGERS SQUAD

Meet the Long Melford management and players...

Jamie Bradbury (Manager) – Now in his fifth season as manager, Jamie guided the club to its highest ever Step 5 points total in 2017/18 and a League Cup Final victory in 2019.

Steve Chisholm (Player/Assistant Manager) – A former Long Melford Youth player who has also played at AFC Sudbury, now combining playing with a management role.

Jonathan Brown (Coach) – A recent addition to the coaching team last season, previously with Mildenhall Town and also coaches with Long Melford Colts.

Brian Dunster (Physio) – A former Melford player and now a very experienced physio, in his 11th season at the club. Previously with Cornard United and Halstead Town.

Matt Walker (Goalkeeper) – Experienced keeper who signed in September 2019 on a dual registration from Coggeshall Town, has also played for Halstead Town.

Steve Adams (Defence/Forward) - Club Captain for several years who lifted the First Division title in 2015 and League Cup in 2019. Began in the Under 18s and has now played 250 senior matches.

Dan Smith (Defence) – Previously with AFC Sudbury, a regular in the team in recent years approaching 150 appearances for the club.

Sam Mills (Defence) – Signed last summer from Haverhill Rovers in a season cut short due to Covid, has also played for Whitton United and AFC Sudbury.

Ross Waugh (Defence) – Ross is now in his ninth season at the club, making well over 250 appearances and chips in with the occasional goal.

Ant Waugh (Defence) – A club icon who was part of the side that won the first division and then helped the Villagers lift the league cup in 2019.

Josh Norris (Defence) - Joined the club's U18s and progressed through to make regular appearances for the reserve side before stepping up for his first team debut in 2021.

Dan Swain (Defence/Midfield) - Over 150 appearances for the club and is comfortable at left back or in midfield. Previously with Cornard, Sudbury and Whitton.

Jake Jackson (Defence/Midfield) - Jake is in his eighth season with the club since joining from AFC Sudbury, a versatile player comfortable at the back or central midfield.

Callum Hemson (Midfield) – Joined in 2017 from AFC Sudbury Academy. Callum has impressed over the last couple of seasons at right back or a more advanced role.

THE VILLAGERS SQUAD

Elliot Walker (Midfield) - Previously played for Border League side Boxted Lodgers, made a successful step up to this level making 50 appearances. Now on his way back from a serious knee injury.

Ollie Emsden (Midfield) - Comfortable on the ball, Ollie joined the Villagers in January 2022 following spells with Woodbridge Town, Witham Town and Saffron Walden.

David Lopez (Midfield) - Returns to the club following a two-year absence at Wivenhoe Town. Helped the Villagers reach the League Cup final in 2019.

Jacob Brown (Midfield) - Signed in December 2018, the experienced former AFC Sudbury and Mildenhall man was influential in the battle to stay up and win the League Cup in 2019.

Ben Judge (Midfield) - Former AFC Sudbury Academy player with a promising future, returns to the club following a brief stint away. Supporters' Player of the Season 2019/20.

Kyle Hurley (Forward) - Signed in 2019 from Cornard United. A wide player who likes to run at defenders and delivers a great cross.

Will Wingfield (Forward/Defence) - Stepped up from U18s scoring on his debut in the FA Vase win at Woodbridge in 2012. In recent years has switched to left back.

Jamie Griffiths (Forward) - A welcome return to the club from Needham Market in 2019, a prolific scorer and Supporters' Player twice in 2015 and 2016.

Hassan Ally (Forward) - A regular in recent years apart from a brief spell with Whitton United. Entertaining player who won the Supporters' award in 2018.

James Dormady (Forward) – Under-18s player who impressed in pre-season while playing for the Reserves and First Team.

George Day (Forward) – Returned to the club this summer. A prolific scorer in local football with Cavendish, also played for Thurlow Nunn clubs Stanway and Whitton.

Ronnie Ward (Forward) - Young forward who joined the club this season and has impressed in the Under-18s with goals and a great attitude to earn a place in the first team squad.

The Club was founded in 1903 as Poringland and District F C as a village side 5 miles from Norwich. The Club played in the Norwich & District League before joining the newly formed Anglian Combination in 1965. After winning the Norfolk Junior Cup in 1979 beating Bradenham Wanderers 5-2, in 1981 beating Wroxham Reserves both at Carrow Road and the Anglian Combination Junior League Cup in 1981 3-2 against Acle, senior status was achieved for the first time in our history in 1982. Also in 1983/84 season we won the Anglian Combination Senior Cup beating Bradenham Wanderers 2-1.

Continuing success forced the Club to move to the Gothic Social Club in Norwich for the 1985/86 season, a campaign that saw us lose 4-1 to Norwich City Reserves at Carrow Road in the Norfolk Senior Cup. A year later we reached the final again only to lose yet again 2-1 to Great Yarmouth.

In 1987 the Club changed its name to Norwich United and Paul Chick was appointed manager. In his first season we finished runners up in the Anglian Combination Premier Division, the following season we won the coveted Sterry Cup.

Norwich United joined the Jewson League Division One in 1989/90 season and finished runners up. Unable to be promoted due to ground facilities we won Division One the following season and moved to our current ground at Plantation Park for the 1991/92 season in the Premier Division. We finished 5th in the league and surpassed our ambitions by winning the Jewson League Cup beating Gorleston 5-2 after a 2-2 draw at Carrow Road.

Season 2001/02 was to prove very memorable, for after spending some time back in Division One, Paul Franklin in his first season as manager assisted by Donny Pye won the Division One title and lost to Clacton in the semi-final of the League Cup. So once again Premier Division football was back at Plantation Park. Season 2005/06 saw The Planters reach the Final of The Norfolk Senior Cup at Carrow Road, only to lose 1-0 To Dereham Town.

In October 2012 Damian Hilton was appointed first team manager. In season 2013/14 Damian brought in John Edridge as his assistant and first team coach, in their first full season together The Planters reached the last 32 in the FA Vase and 6th place in the Thurlow Nunn Premier League. Season 2014/15 saw the Planters reach the last 16 in the FA Vase and for the first time in their history win the Premier League Title and were winners of the League Cup completing a memorable double a massive achievement for Damian & John.

Season 2015/16 saw us retain the Premier League Title a massive achievement from the players and Manager John Edridge assisted by Steve Eastaugh and Darren Plowman.

The Club owes much of it's success to the continuing support of Club Chairman Mr. John Hilditch, President Mr.Michael Miles and Vice Chairman Mr. Peter Bowyer.

TODAY'S OPPOSITION

Our previous meeting with Norwich United took place in October when the Planters won 2-1 in the reverse fixture in Norfolk.

In an evenly-matched contest, neither side could find the early breakthrough. The pitch played a small part in the first two goals when they did arrive, however. After another high ball forward from the home side just before half time, an aerial challenge 30 yards out saw the ball drop to JORDAN FORBES in space. He carried forward and stroked towards the corner of the net from the edge of the box. Matt Walker was down low to try to repel, but a bobble took the ball over his reach and the home side were in front.

After the break, Melford came out with added spark and some excellent passing football created a series of openings down the left hand side, but no one was on hand to convert. That was until the hour mark when a shot forced a same from the Norwich keeper Ryan Dickerson. The ball fell to JACOB BROWN but in a crowded Norwich box with his back to goal he had to find wriggle room to turn and send a low shot goal bound. Once again, the bobble outfoxed the keeper and the ball bounced over Dickerson's body to level matters.

Melford went in search of a winner. Dan Smith coming close with a shot off the bar. However, when the next goal did arrive, it came for Norwich. A quick one-two released FORBES down the left, and as he approached the box, cut in to bend the ball into the top corner.

Jamie Griffiths saw a free-kick bounce agonisingly wide of the post, and in the last seconds, a ball into the box with everyone forward produced a melee on the goal line, which somehow stayed out. Norwich held on for a hard-earned win in what was a physical but even and fair contest, with neither side picking up a booking.


